

# The Crucifixion: The Easter Story

<b>Aim:</b> I can remember key events in Holy Week and begin to question them.	<b>Success Criteria:</b> I can create a timeline of events in Holy Week.  I can create my own questions to investigate the events of Holy Week.	<b>Resources:</b> <b>Lesson Pack</b> Scissors - 1 per child Glue - 1 per group Whiteboards and whiteboard pens
	<b>Key/New Words:</b> Crucifixion, Easter, tomb, stone, disciple, Last Supper, chronological order.	<b>Preparation:</b> <b>Question Sheet Activity Sheet</b> – 1 per child Differentiated <b>Timeline Activity Sheet</b> - 1 per child <b>The Easter Story Activity Sheet</b>

**Prior Learning:** It will be helpful if children have a basic understanding of the Easter story from Year 3 'Good Friday' unit.

## Learning Sequence

	<b>What Do We Already Know?</b> In pairs, the children recall any information that they can remember from the Easter story and the events of Holy Week on their whiteboards. As a class, share these thoughts.				
	<b>The Easter Story:</b> Recap as a class or in pairs, the Easter Story by reading <b>The Easter Story Activity Sheet</b> . Then, returning to the <b>Lesson Presentation</b> , ask the children to give more detail to the story based on what they have just read. <i>How could we show these events in a chronological order?</i>				
	<b>Timeline:</b> Go through the principles of a timeline briefly to refresh memories and then discuss which of the three events would go where on the timeline on the <b>Lesson Presentation</b> .				
	<b>Activity:</b> Using a differentiated <b>Timeline Activity Sheet</b> , the children complete their own individual time lines. <table style="width: 100%; border: none;"> <tr> <td style="text-align: center; width: 33%;">  Children use pictures to create their own timeline on <b>Timeline Activity Sheet</b>.         </td> <td style="text-align: center; width: 33%;">  Children use key word prompts to create their own timeline on <b>Timeline Activity Sheet</b>.         </td> <td style="text-align: center; width: 33%;">  Children use the template on <b>Timeline Activity Sheet</b> to create their own timeline of events.         </td> </tr> </table>	Children use pictures to create their own timeline on <b>Timeline Activity Sheet</b> . 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	<b>Question Time:</b> <i>If you were able to have a conversation with either God or Jesus, what questions would you want to ask about the Easter Story?</i> The children generate questions on their <b>Question Sheet Activity Sheet</b> . Continue this with a hot seating activity with children answering as either Jesus or God. ( <i>Lead the children to question whether or not God intended Jesus to die. Was it all part of His plan?</i> )				

## Taskit

**Interviewit:** Children write out an interview script for interviewing either God or Jesus about The Easter Story.

**Actit:** Children act one of the events from Holy Week and the other children have to guess which event they are acting out.
