Activity: children will practise using the conjunction *if* to connect two clauses. For example, Sophie could fly high up in the sky if she had a magic cape.

- Start by looking through the *if* PowerPoint. Look at how *if* works as a conjunction *if is used to say that one thing can, will or might happen or be true, depending on another thing happening or being true.*
- Work through the power point together.
- Children to refer back to their everyday objects that change when they use their imagination. Then write a simple sentence about what their object can do, for example *Stanley can catch a fish with his rod* children to then add *if* and a second clause. The second clause should stat what would happen if the first clause was the cause. For example *Stanley will be able to write in the sand if his stick is a pencil.*
- Children to then record between 4 and 6 sentences using the conjunction *if* to join two clauses together.

Extension: children to record their *if* sentences in a narrative piece of text.
