Safeguarding

Safeguarding and child protection is of the upmost importance in our schools, therefore, we have a rigorous on-boarding process for all volunteers and promise that:-

- We will ask for a completed volunteer declaration form
- If appropriate, we will seek references
- If appropriate, we will conduct a formal interview to gauge suitability for the role
- We will verify your identity
- We will confirm your Right to Work in the UK (as volunteers in schools are considered 'workers' for the purposes of Home Office criteria).
- We will request completion of the Rehabilitation of Offenders Declaration Form
- If appropriate, we will undertake an enhanced DBS disclosure.
- We will ensure that a Childcare Disqualification Staff Declaration Form is completed to check that you are not disqualified from providing childcare in the school setting.
- If appropriate, an overseas police check will be carried out
- If appropriate, social media checks will be undertaken
