legends. In our writing journeys, we are going to be looking at a range of myths from Ancient Greece and designing our own mythical creature to feature in a myth written by us! As well as this we will be writing our own persuasive travel leaflet persuading them to go to Ancient

Greece.

The house with Chicken Legs

In our maths this term, we will be confinying to develop our calculation strategies in multiplication and division, then applying all of our calculation skills across the maths curriculum. We will be furthering our understanding of fractions and decimals as part of number and how these are relevant in our everyday lives. We will explore measurements, including area, perimeter and conversion between units of measure.

What makes us civilised?

In Science, for the first half term, we will be studying Circulation and the heart. The children will be identifying and naming the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describing the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. They will consider the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function. During the second half term, the children will be comparing the life cycles of an amphibian, mammal, insect and bird. They will learn how living things are classified into broad groups according to common characteristics, based on similarities and differences

Chronology Significance

Key concepts:

Impact

This half term we are learning about the ancient civilisations: Greek, Shang, Sumer and Egyptian. Together, we will compare and contrast their achievements. Every week, we will recap a timeline to ensure we can place the civilisations in chronological order. After half term, we will study Ancient Greece in depth. We will look at the impact the Greeks have on us today and what we have learned from them. To finish, we will be interviewing an Ancient Greek using the popular book 'Interview with Cleopatra' by Andy Seed as our guide.

In our RE learning journey this term we will be considering the concept of Peace, explaining its significance and value within Islam and applying our understanding to peace within our own lives. Following this, we will be focusing on the concept of resurrection. Our focus will be on the question "Easter: What happened next?" and the different ideas we and others have about resurrection.

For music this term we will be exploring musical notations, pitch, structure and composing our own melodic scale.
