In maths this term we will be learning about place value, finding one more and one less, understanding tens and ones and counting in 2s, Ss and 10s. Through looking at real life problems the children will be learning how to add and subtract using concrete resource, pictorial representation and abstract number sentences.

Yr 1: This term, we are beginning our longitudinal study by learning about the seasons and changes that happen in each season. In doing this, we will learn about the different trees and plants that grow in our environment and learn the terms evergreen and deciduous.

We will be focusing on working as a class to create our class charter, discuss feelings and how they might make us behave. We will discuss how people have different ways of expressing their feelings.

In Computing this term, we are learning to use Scratch Junior, which teaches children computer programming. We will be making our own robot maze games by following instructions, tinkering (having a go ourselves seeing what we can do!) and setting codes (and debugging them - changing them - when they don't work!). The children will all learn to log on typing their names.

During our PE lessons the children will be learning how to challenge themselves, and to understand where they are with their learning. We are going to be working on our ball skills, looking at throwing, catching and striking a ball. After half term we will be exploring dance and moving to music in different ways. We will be learning how to collaborate, work together and support others in their learning.
